RULES

1. All entries on Official Entry Forms. Entries & fee to reach the **Show Secretary at The Old Chapel by August 18th**
2. Exhibits may be staged on the evening before the show 6 - 6.30 pm or the morning of the show 7.30-9.30 am, after which time **no exhibits will be accepted**. No exhibits to be removed before **4.15 pm**.
3. All exhibitors are requested to leave as many exhibits as possible for sale by Auction at the close of the show. The proceeds will be credited to the funds of the show. Exhibits in the sections 1 & 2 will be removed for auction at 4.30pm **unless clearly marked NOT FOR SALE**.
4. If, in the opinion of the Judges, exhibits are not of sufficient merit, or of sufficient quantity, prizes may be withheld accordingly.
5. Entry fees to be forfeited if the exhibitor fails to stage entry.
6. Two or more persons may not exhibit separately from the same garden or allotment in any one class in sections 1 & 2
7. Any complaint must be made in writing and signed by the objector by 4pm on the day of the show and deposited with a fee of £5.00. The £5.00 will be forfeited if the committee think the objection frivolous. Any complaints received in accordance with the above will be dealt with strictly by the committee.
8. All Pot Plants must be in the exhibitor's possession for a minimum of 60 days prior to the show.
9. All produce must be grown by the exhibitor himself on his own garden or specified allotment. Should a complaint in this respect arise, the committee reserve the right to inspect the premises of the exhibitor, and if thought justified, the exhibitor will be disqualified.
10. All adult exhibitors must be resident in this parish and thereby liable for council tax, all children must be resident in this parish. (Except classes 79 & 80.)
11. All handicrafts must be the work of the exhibitor.
12. The committee will not be held responsible for any loss or damage incurred, but reasonable care will be taken of all exhibits.
13. The holders of cups shall return them to the show secretary by 3rd July 2008.
14. Entries in sections 5 & 6 will not be accepted if previously exhibited in Sevenhampton, Charlton Abbots and Hawling Parishes Produce Show.
15. The Committee reserves the right to interpret the rules and alter times shown.
16. The Committee's decision shall be final.
