Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on Wednesday 23 January 2008

1. There were no apologies for absence.
2. There were no declarations of interest.
3. The **minutes**, having been circulated were approved, signed and dated as a true record of proceedings of the meeting held on 21 November 2007.
4. **Matters arising:**
 - a. **Noticeboards** – only one quotation had been received so far but it was RESOLVED that hardwood boards would be required with maintenance once a year to be included in the price subject to the agreement of the PCC in respect of the one for the church.
 - b. In view of the new **on-line planning system** it was RESOLVED that the clerk would keep a list in the parish council file in the post office showing recent planning applications and if anybody wished to view on line the clerk's computer would be made available.
 - c. The **hedges** had been cut back around Brockhampton post box
5. **Financial:** Payments: GAPTC – training £60; Anne Jenkin for Village Live photocopying £24; SLCC subscription £59; Clerk £424.71. Balances: £7173.12 Barclays and £6116.53 Leeds & Holbeck. It was then proposed by Di Brown, seconded by Alison Giles and RESOLVED that the transfer of £1000 minuted at the last meeting could be made to the Way Forward fund.
6. **Planning:** The wind turbine application at Nash Barn Sevenhampton was to be determined shortly by District planning committee. There had been no hearing of the Appeal on East Lodge as yet. After discussion it was RESOLVED that Harry Body be appointed Planning Representative.
7. **Complaints procedure:** RESOLVED it was not required at present
8. **Gloucestershire Charter:** RESOLVED not to sign up at present
9. **Parish Plan:** RESOLVED it was not required at the moment as the Village Appraisal and Design Statement were still relevant. Way Forward – the clerk to update and issue. The parish response to climate change would be an agenda item for the annual parish meeting in March – ideas would be required.
10. **Grass cutting tender:** The clerk had already issued the notices and tenders would be discussed at the March meeting.
11. **Next meeting:** Confirmed as 19 March following the annual parish meeting and there being no other business the chairman closed the meeting at 9.15pm
